


Fame. Timothy Blevins and Crystal Ayala were recognized for their support as office volunteer and health fair organizer, respectively.

NAMIWALKS 2016 TEAM SPOTLIGHT

TEAM ERIC

Each year teams of families, friends, and coworkers gather together at NAMIWalks around the country to help reduce the stigma of mental illness in our communities. In El Paso we have been honored to meet many teams over the past few years. For our first team spotlight we chose Team Eric, an outstanding group from NAMIWalks 2016 comprised of the family and friends of Eric Wilson.

I sat down with Brenna and Nick Bandstra, the sister and brother-in-law of Eric, back in April. Brenna described her brother as a "fighter his entire life." Eric was born with a congenital heart defect and as a result experienced many physical limitations throughout his life. When he was an adolescent he was diagnosed with Bipolar Disorder; much of the anger and waves of emotions that he experienced were a result of those physical limitations. "He did not want to be represented by his diagnosis," Brenna said, "he was such a dreamer." Her favorite part about Eric was his infectious laugh and sense of humor.

Brenna stumbled upon NAMI in 2012 while visiting the El Paso Psychiatric Center as part of her schooling. She knew that both Eric

and her family needed support and resources to help Eric cope. At times there was a feeling that "it was their burden to bear and there were no resources available to them," Nick said of Brenna's family. Finding NAMI provided support and a gentle reminder that they were not alone.

It has been a little over a year since Brenna and her family said goodbye to Eric. Following his death in April 2016, Brenna and her family created a NAMIWalks team. They invited many of the people who loved and supported Eric throughout his life to walk together to celebrate Eric's life and honor those who have been affected by mental illness. It wasn't until after his death that Brenna and her family realized how many people Eric had impacted in the community. Brenna and Nick describe Eric as a genuine person who enjoyed the pleasantries of life; talking with people in the neighborhood, hearing about the things the people around him were doing. "He was always there waiting with a handshake," Nick remembered.

"Life itself is like a huge struggle," Nick commented, "we are all going through these battles ... it truly is a beautiful thing. Unfortunately, that struggle or that battle sometimes is with mental illness, and it ends too early. But it's still something to be celebrated."

Brenna, Nick and their family and friends are gearing up for another celebration this year at NAMIWalks 2017. Brenna's parents have been busy designing and crafting red bracelets and t-shirts for all team members. They invite anyone from the community to join their team (dogs included) and walk alongside them to celebrate, mourn, and help reduce the stigma of mental illness. Whoever you walk for, whatever the reason, you are welcome to be a part of the Team Eric community.
